

TEACHING STUDENTS TO SLAM THE 6 × TABLES

A 6 × TABLE TEACHING STRATEGY

This sheet is for countries using the 1 × 6 pattern

I know **1 × 6**, **2 × 6**, **5 × 6** and **10 × 6**

If I get stuck with harder 6 × tables,
I can use my 5 × and 1 × tables.
I add them together to get the answer.

Like this:

$$4 \times 6 = 4 \times 5 = 20 \\ 4 \times 1 = 4 \\ \underline{\quad} \\ 24$$



Don't keep numbers in your head!
Write them down or you may lose them.
It happens to me all the time!
